Attendance

Did you know that attending school regularly and on time helps children feel better about school and themselves! Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, everyday is important!

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school
- Missing 10% (about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read
- Absences and tardiness effects the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up
- · Punctuality is habit forming—teach our students to respect the time of other individuals by being on time



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Canada Learning Bond Sign-Up

Get up to \$2,000 for your child's education from the Government of Canada



Your child is eligible if they were born in 2004 or later and your family income is under \$47,000 per year.

Come out to an event near you. Sign up for your Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP) and Canada Learning Bond that day! No deposit of your own money is ever needed.

You will need your photo ID, and birth certificates and Social Insurance Numbers (SINs) for everyone.

- If you need a SIN, we can help you get one from Service Canada.
- If you need a birth certificate, get help on-site.
- We can also help with income tax filing!

Lakewoods School Rules

Rules help us know what to do and how to act with each other. The rules that we have in place at Lakewoods also help to ensure student safety throughout the day. Our school rules are clearly outlined in our Code of Conduct that can be found in the front of every agenda. Please take time to review the rules with your child. Regular reminders from home about the importance of following school rules make for more positive and successful interactions with other students, staff and community members.

Lakewoods Lunchtime Rules

Students are reminded that eating lunch at school is a very important responsibility. Our Lunchroom Supervisors work very hard to ensure student are safe in their lunch room and ensuring that allergies are attended to. Here are some reminders about indoor and outdoor behavioral expectations at Lakewoods:

- Always eat at your desk
- Do not share your food
- Use your manners by eating with care and cleaning up your space
- Listen to your lunchroom supervisor by staying on time and in your seat until asked to go outside
- Hands off outside, no rough housing
- Look for an orange jacket to report any problems on the yard
- Use the washroom/fountain with permission
- Line up quietly and enter the school with your teacher calmly

Thanks goes to our dedicated Lunchroom Supervisors who work hard each day to ensure all students are safe at Lakewoods and following the rules. As we are a walking school, we encourage students to go home for lunch whenever possible.



Students from K-8 are invited to take part in the annual "Forest of Reading". The Ontario Library Association selects various fiction and non-fiction texts that students will read over the course of the school year. Voting for Forest of Reading takes place in the Spring and is very exciting event! Students can let their teacher or library volunteer know if they are interested in joining.

The Canada Learning Bond (CLB) is money that the Government of Canada deposits directly into a child's Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP) account to help parents get a head start on saving for their child's education after high school. There is not cost to families. This money is held in trust for your child and then they can withdraw the money when they attend college or university, after high school. Our public health nurses will be at Lakewoods P.S. in the front entrance to share more information with you about how you can sign up and where to go. 

Durham Region Transit—Assistance Program (TAP)

Starting November 1st, Durham Region Transit is launching the "TAP" pilot program, a Transit Assistance Program for low-income individuals that improves transit access and affordability for Ontario Works (OW) and Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) clients.

TAP is available on PRESTO only and customers can ride DRT unlimited for the month for only \$44.80 To learn more about TAP:

OW clients should contact their Social Services caseworker and ask about receiving a pre-loaded PRESTO card with the TAP concession applied.

ODSP clients should bring their monthly statement as proof of eligibility to one of the DRT Presto point of sales at DRT customer Service Centre, Durham Region Headquarters or Oshawa Centre.
