

Class placements

It is that time of year where our teachers are preparing for Class placement meetings. Teachers and administrators work collaboratively to determine the best class placement for all of our students. The following factors are considered:

Your input is valued and you are welcome to provide information that may assist your child's teacher in making these decisions.
