

- Current living conditions are unaffordable, overcrowded, unsafe or unhealthy



Great Beginnings is a free, play-based, developmentally appropriate program designed to prepare children for a successful transition into Kindergarten.

The program is specifically designed for children entering Junior Kindergarten in September 2022, and who have never attended an Early Learning, Childcare, or Nursery School program. The goal of the program is for every child to enter Junior Kindergarten healthy and secure, emotionally and socially competent, eager, and confident.

## **Class placements**

It is that time of year where our teachers are preparing for Class placement meetings. Teachers and administrators work collaboratively to determine the best class placement for all of our students. The following factors are considered:

Learning styles, the individual needs of the student, social skills, peer interactions, gender combinations, Ministry guidelines regarding class sizes and teaching styles.

Your input is valued and you are welcome to provide information that may assist your child's teacher in making these decisions. Appropriate details include your child's placement history, the type of learner you perceive he/she is, the style of instruction he/she would most benefit from and/or particular medical information that impacts learning. Parents may not pick a specific teacher for their child.
